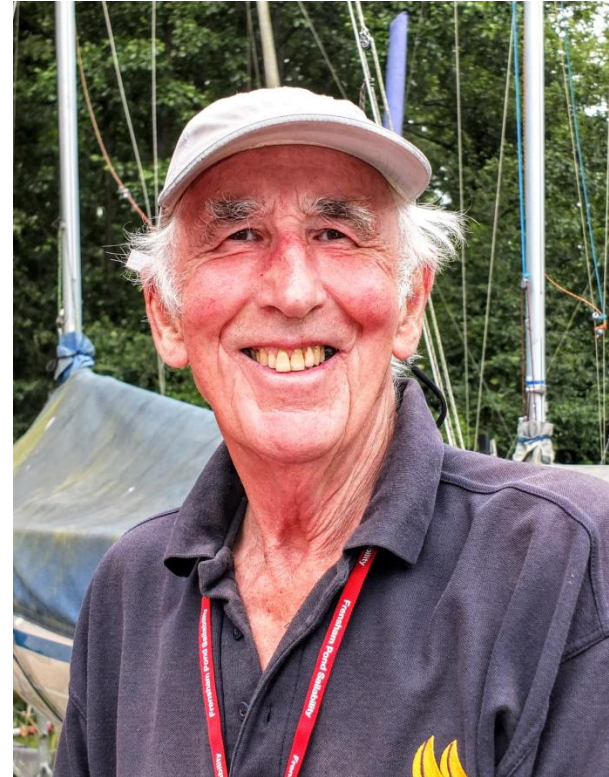

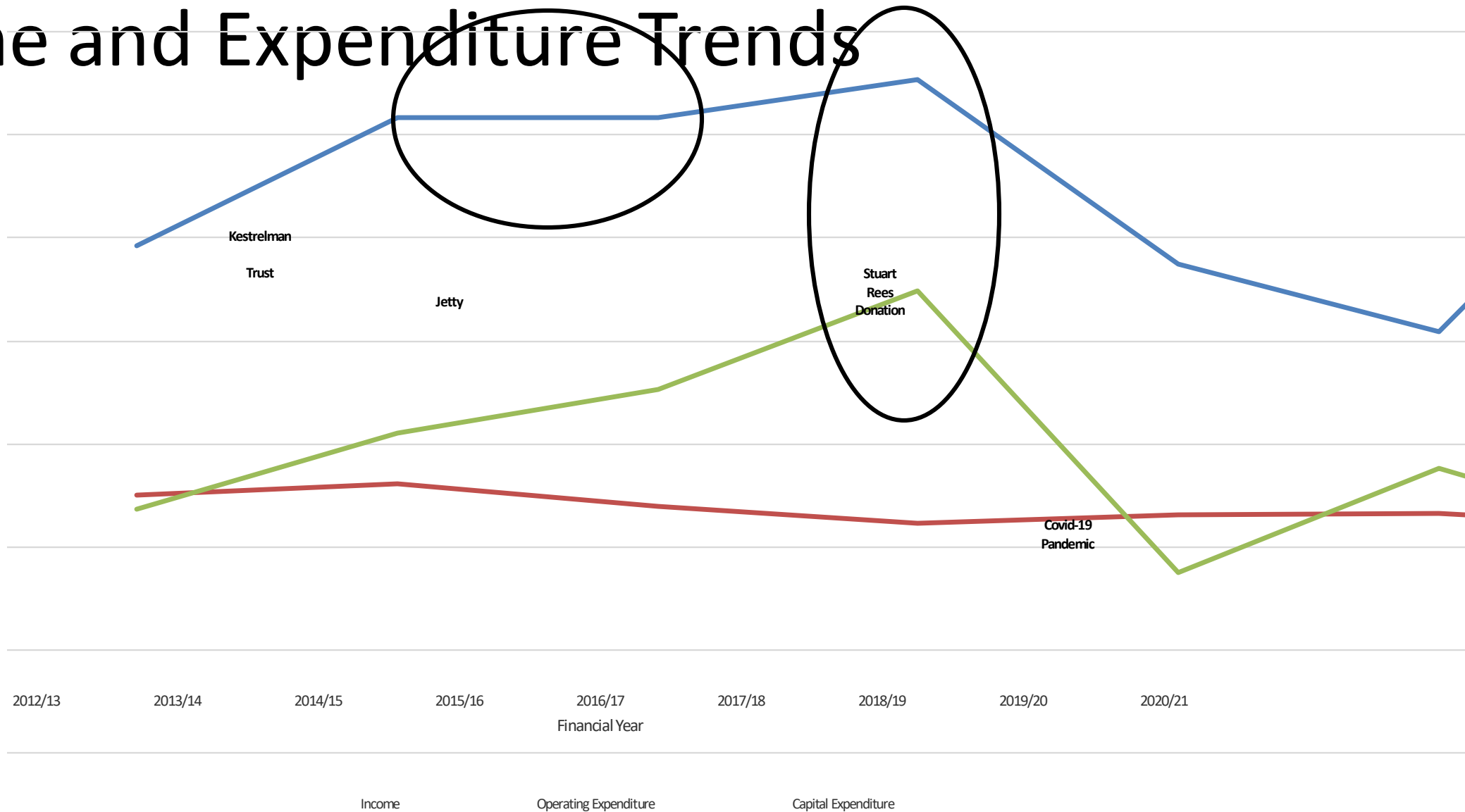

Sailability returns to the pond after lockdown

FRENSHAM Pond Sailability is delighted that Saturday morning sailing has recommenced after lockdown. The Youth and Progress groups alternate every Saturday throughout the

season and cater for youth sailors plus young adults who can sail independently. Because of Covid restrictions, only those sailors able to sail on their own, or with a member of their

household bubble, can attend at the moment. The club hope to open up the sessions to all young sailors once it is possible to have two people in a boat. Sessions began at the start

of April. Conditions during those first few weeks were very challenging, with strong and cold north-easterly winds. All the sailors performed well above expectations, particularly impressive

after 17 months away. Their comments as they came off the water emphasised how important this activity is to their well-being and mental health. Lisa Skirrow and Luke Anstey ran the sessions.

Sailors' national success

FRENSHAM Pond Sailability star Lindsay Burns beat all-comers to win the 2.3 fleet title at the Hansa National Championships at Rutland Sailing Club.

Frensham clubmate Lara Sturgis finished third. Thirty boats and 38 sailors took part over the two days of competition.

Conditions were good, with a fair breeze on Saturday with light winds, constantly shifting on Sunday. Lindsay said: "It was a great National with a mixed fleet and a true test of sailing on big courses. Credit to the race officers for setting excellent courses."

In the 303.1 Person fleet, Frensham's Mike Everitt took second place, just beating Margaret Foreman, with Dennis Hantman eighth. James and Maddy Woosnam won the 303.2 two-person fleet.

FOUR Frensham Pond Sailability sailors travelled to Palermo in Sicily to take part in the 2021 Hansa World Championships. Conditions were extremely changeable all week - racing was interrupted by rain on the first day, but the weather improved as the week went on and the final day was very exciting and demanded first class technical sailing. Para World sailing manager Massimo Dighe said: "This was an excellent exhibition of para sailing in single and double competition. We commend the Hansa class for creating a boat for all sailors and promoting inclusion within the class. The growth of para sailing around the world is great for the future of the sport. Congratulations to the winners, and everybody for being able to take part in the championships."

To the delight of the Frensham supporters and the whole of the British team, Paul Phillips achieved a superb third place in the Hansa Liberty Class. Paul has been an active sailor at Frensham Pond for 15 years, and competes at home and abroad.

Ben Ainslie Trophy success

Record-breaking win

FRENSHAM Pond Sailability marks its 20th anniversary this year, and this was made particularly special by their win of the Ben Ainslie Trophy for a record-breaking 14th time at the recently-held Frensham Traveller Trophy (TT).

This award is made to the sailing club that achieves the highest overall placing in a series of TT races held at Sailability Clubs all around England, from Bristol to Waveney and north to Notts County.

A team from Frensham regularly travels to other clubs to take part in the Hansa TT, and

this year the winning team comprised Lindsay Burns, Mike Everitt and Paul Phillips.

The competition concluded with races at Frensham Pond. During this busy day teams from other clubs converged on Frensham Pond to enjoy a day of challenging racing with a cool, but constant north-easterly wind.

Eleven visiting sailors met with 14 from Frensham, including four taking part for the

first time.

The first races were for the Hansa 2.3 fleet, where local star Lindsay Burns stormed to an outright win to add to her wins in the other races in the series.

The racing was close for the other positions, with Ray Bedwell and Lara Sturgis, both from Frensham, coming second and third, and Andrew Lebec fourth in his first TT.

The Hansa 303, one-person fleet was the largest with 11 boats taking part in some extremely close racing.

Local sailor James Woosnam squeezed second place to Rory McKinna (Clyde Cruising Club) because of some very lucky shifts on the last leg of two races with Richard May, also from Frensham, managing to clinch overall third place on his debut TT.

Harry Kennington stormed up the beats, to finish fourth overall.

Mike Everitt has had a brilliant TT season but could only manage fifth place on home

water.

But Hannah Nicoll (Whitefriars) in her fourth TT added sparkle with an excellent sixth place overall.

Judith Riggs and Dennis Hantman (both Frensham) had the distinction of finishing a race in a dead heat and on equal points, with Judith getting seventh on countback.

In the Hansa 303 two-person fleet success went to sailors from New Forest and Chesil but Frensham's Colin Free-

man and Paul Kingston put in a creditable performance.

The Liberty class saw six boats taking part with Paul Phillips and Tessa Watkins from Frensham battling it out with the others.

Paul knew only an outright win at Frensham would be needed to take the series.

After a series of close races Paul found some extra speed and pulled away to the finish to claim the TT win and with it the TT series to add to his 2021

Nationals win.

The day had an unforeseen problem, however. Six boats from visiting clubs got stuck on the M1 motorway, so emergency measures had to be taken.

Generous sailors loaned their boats so the competition could continue and the missing boats eventually arrived and thanks are due to all the sailors and volunteer helpers who made this happen.

"Isn't it great that we are able to meet up again in person – what a horrible 18 months we have all endured, with a major impact on all our sporting activities," he said.

He praised the large number of sponsors, whose donations enabled the event to take place, and Waverley Borough Council for their support to Sport Haslemere.

"Not only do we receive a financial grant from them, we also receive advice and assistance from their expert members of staff," he said. "But none of this would be possible without the mums and dads who ferry their youngsters around, the people who run the clubs and, of course, the athletes we recognised on the stage."

Melanie Odell, the president of Sport Haslemere, presented the main awards, while guest speaker Michelle Cooper enthralled the audience with her tales of reaching the top of her sport, middle-distance running, and representing GB. One of the biggest cheers of the night was reserved for Andy Robson from Frensham Pond Sailability, who won the disability award.

In 2013, at the age of 34, Andy suffered a kitesurfing accident which resulted in a serious brain injury. After spending four years in hospital for recovery and rehabilitation, he was keen to rebuild an active life and started sailing with Frensham Pond Sailability.

As his confidence and morale increased, he discovered he could progress to sailing solo – and after his first solo sail he shorted "freedom", reflecting his appreciation that sailing is

one area of his life where he has total control and independence.

In September this year, he competed in the Harisa Class UK Traveller Trophy Regatta held at Frensham Pond where he was pitted against experienced sailors from across the UK.

Swallows Trampoline Club were one of the big winners on the night, picking up five awards.

They were named sports club of the year, Sophie Perryman won the young volunteer of the year award, Jessica Nesbitt clinched the junior sports personality of the year prize, Faye Joyce was named young coach of the year, and Ben Eeles received one of the five Create a Star bursaries handed out on the night.

And to round off a great night, Cerys McIntosh, a previous Swallows member, also received a bursary.

Peter Babb picked up the sport initiative award for his work at two Hindhead clubs.

His tireless work with the cricket and bowls clubs underlined his role as a key member of the Hindhead sporting community.

The sports personality of the year was Michael Charman – known to all since school days simply as 'Chick' – who has been the key force which has kept Lynnhire Cricket Club going for the past 30 years.

"He absolutely embodies the spirit of cricket, and the spirit of village cricket in particular," said Melanie.

The sports bursaries provide a grant of £500 to potential stars of the future. Chris added: "Since 2010 Haslemere Sports Association has invested more than £50,000 to help these youngsters achieve their ambitions – and two of our previous award winners have now turned professional."

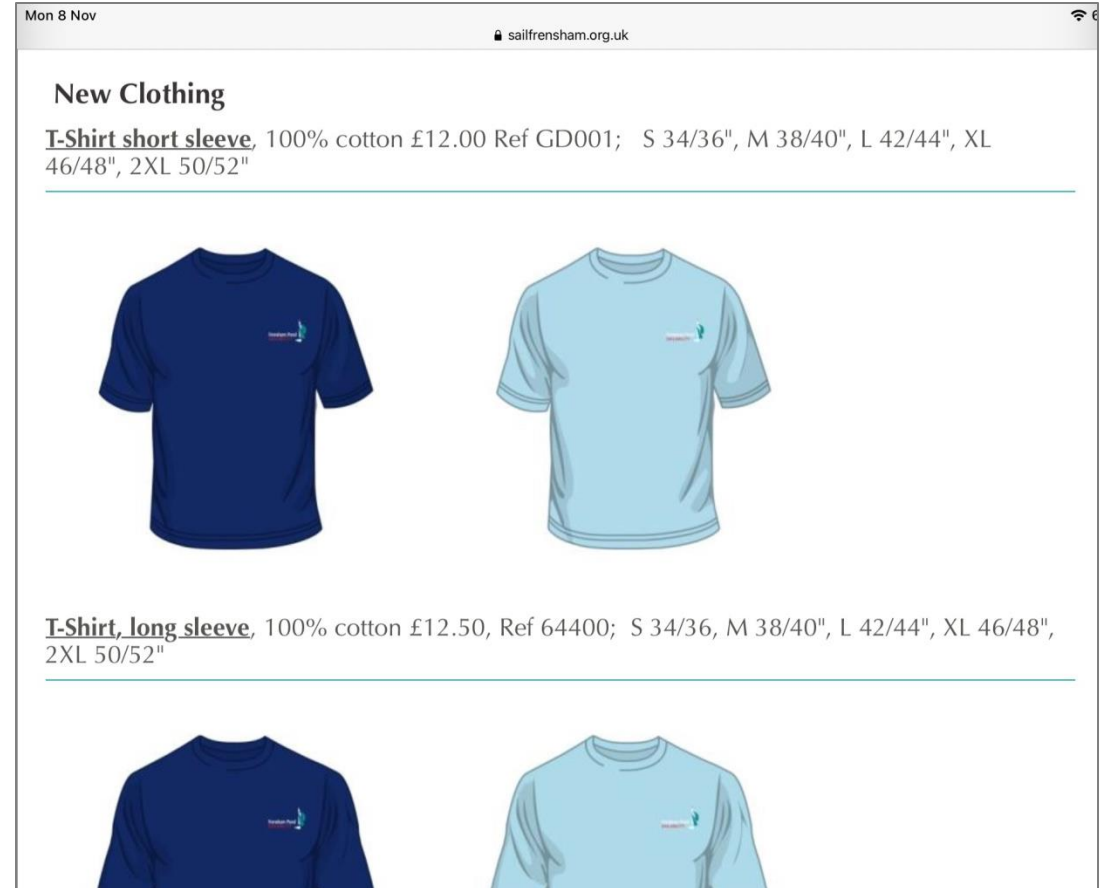
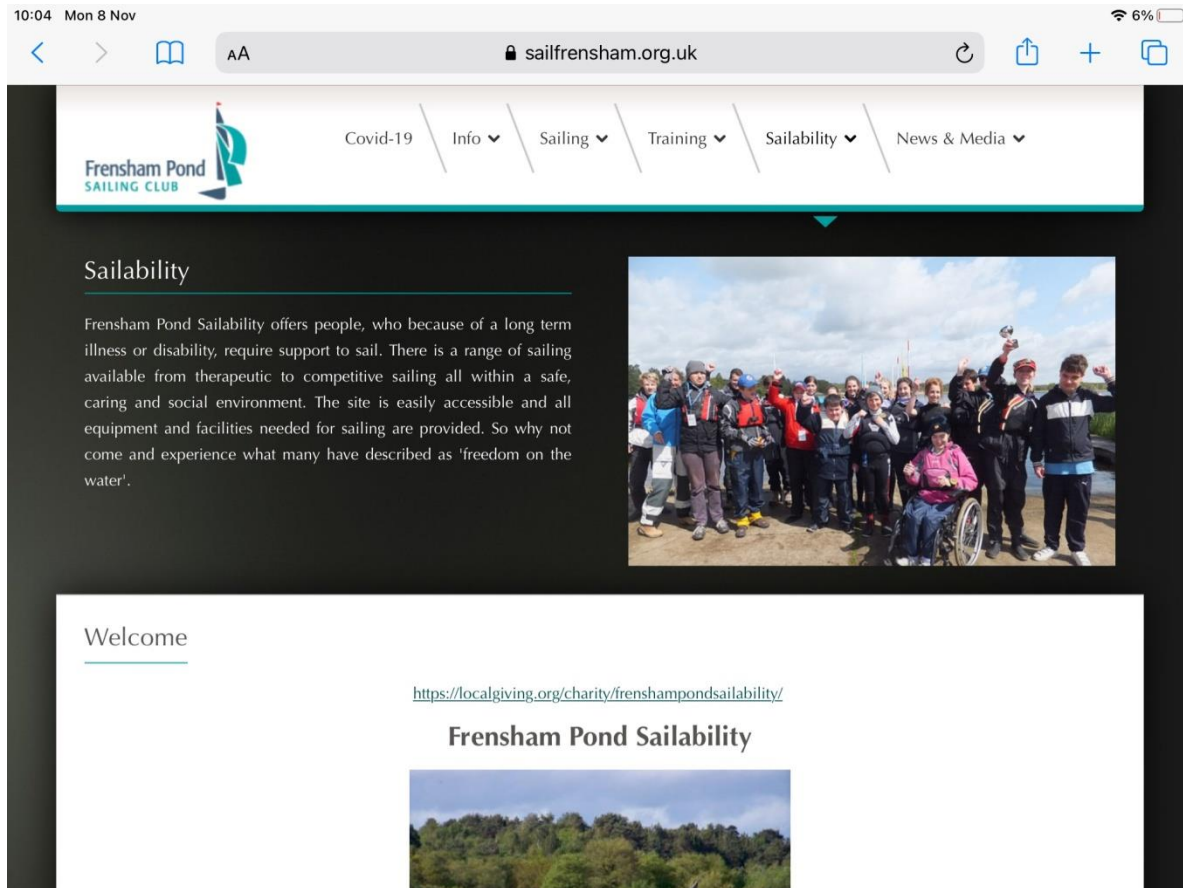
